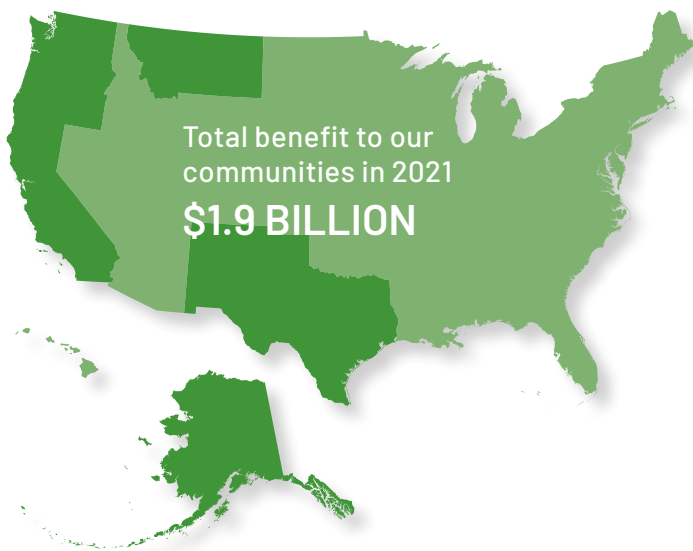




2021 COMMUNITY BENEFIT SNAPSHOT

We started 2021 with the hope of COVID-19 vaccines that became powerful tools during three major surges in COVID-19 volumes. Through the year, our family of organizations navigated multiple mandated shutdowns and other disruptions in care while ensuring support for our dedicated teams.

Even with these tremendous challenges, Providence continued to invest in our communities, guided by our strategic plan and our community benefit priorities. In 2021, we provided \$1.9 billion in community benefit, which represents an increase of more than \$366 million since the pandemic began.

Their work, supported by our community benefit and our other locally-focused investments, has made a real difference in neighborhoods, regions and countries with unmet needs.
