

	<p>Code Red (Fire)</p> <p>To be initiated when you see fire or smoke or smell something burning.</p>
	<p>Code Blue (Respiratory/ Cardiac Arrest)</p> <p>To be initiated when someone stops breathing or heart stops</p>
	<p>Code Orange (Hazardous spill)</p> <p>To be initiated when hazardous material is spilled</p>
	<p>Code Gray (Combative Person)</p> <p>To be initiated when someone is combative or threatening someone</p>
	<p>Code Silver (Weapon)</p> <p>To be initiated when someone has a weapon and you are concerned about your own safety or the safety of others</p>
	<p>Amber Alert (Abduction)</p> <p>To be initiated when a patient is missing or you fear there is an abduction/kidnapping</p>
	<p>Rapid Response Team (Clinical Response)</p> <p>To be initiated when you have concerns about the abrupt change in your patient's condition and you need additional help to assess patient. An ICU nurse, RT and Hospitalist will respond.</p>
	<p>External Triage (Mass Casualty)</p> <p>House supervisor will call</p>
	<p>Internal Triage (Internal Event)</p> <p>To be initiated when there is an internal emergency. (examples: bomb threat, loss of medical gas, flood on hospital unit) Administration will determine the best method of communication based on event issue.</p> <p>Note: This code may not be called overhead depending on subject matter.</p>
	<p>Code Clear</p> <p>To be initiated when code is cleared.</p>
