Empowering At-Risk Community Members to Navigate Chronic Conditions

The CARE Network in Napa is a mission-driven program providing intensive medical and psychosocial care management for uninsured or underinsured low-income patients. Patients receive a continuum of care that increases self-sufficiency, quality of life and health outcomes, while decreasing health care costs.

Virtual Perinatal Support Persists During COVID-19

Through extensive bilingual educational opportunities offered by Paso a Paso, Latinx parents are empowered to build personalized parenting plans while being treated with compassion, dignity and respect. Also, Humboldt RISE (Resilience and Inclusion through Support and Empowerment) diagnoses and treats perinatal women experiencing substance use disorder, while offering tools for support and empowerment.

Mobile Health Resources Instill Hope for Underserved Patients

Our Mobile Health Clinic provides equitable care, access and support in a time filled with myriad unknowns. The wheeled clinic provides free acute and chronic medical care to local underserved populations. During COVID-19, it has helped to decrease hospital admissions and emergency room visits by administering hundreds of COVID-19 tests and flu shots, specifically supporting local homeless shelters and high-need neighborhoods.
