A REFUGE FOR HOMELESS WOMEN

In downtown Spokane, there is a beacon of hope and help for homeless women. Aptly named Hope House - this beacon provides a refuge for the poor and vulnerable. Run by Volunteers of America, Hope House provides 36 emergency shelter beds each night to women experiencing homelessness.

Among the beds at Hope House, a medical respite program provides a safe place to heal or recover from acute, post-acute or a flare of chronic health conditions. Through its community investment, Providence funds six of the available seven respite beds.

Women are provided other basic needs, crisis intervention, meaningful activities, life skills classes, social support and health care stabilization.

This is one of many community partnerships formed across the state that are addressing the long-term needs while serving the community's most vulnerable people.
