Acknowledgements such as these, which recognize our compassionate care and demonstrations of quality outcomes, don't happen accidentally. The New Linear Accelerator: Because cancer is not a single disease

Cancer. The word alone strikes fear and anxiety even in the most stoic of people. In 2016, cancer was responsible for twenty-four percent of all deaths in California, just one percent behind heart disease.

At St. Joseph Hospital, we strive to provide the community we serve with the most advanced technology, ensuring our patients have the best possible chance of detection and treatment.

The Center for Cancer Prevention and Treatment has a robust screening, diagnostic and treatment process in place. In 2017 alone, there were more than 15,000 patient visits for radiation therapy, including pediatric cancer patients. Building upon this process, the Varian TrueBeam™ Linear Accelerator — which is the next step in advanced radiotherapy technology — destroys cancer by focusing high-energy rays on the cancer cells while preserving the healthy tissue that borders the tumor.

During treatment, radiation must also pass through healthy tissues to reach the tumor. This new technology calculates angles and dose rates so the lowest possible dose is delivered to the surrounding healthy tissue while the maximum dose is delivered to the tumor.

The new linear accelerator will improve treatment for all cancers that require radiation.

The new linear accelerator will allow caregivers to treat more patients, help achieve better treatment outcomes, and continue to improve patient experience and safety while lowering per patient treatment costs.

This new technology is a \$4.5 million philanthropic priority that is part of the hospital's \$50 Million *Innovating for a Healthier Community* comprehensive campaign. The TrueBeam™ Linear Accelerator has many patient benefits:

- It is faster and more powerful, allowing patients with more complex cases to be treated and potentially reducing treatment sessions from approximately 40 minutes down to five.
- It uses improved imaging to locate and precisely define the boundaries of a tumor so all cancer cells are treated. The computer controls the beam's shape as it moves 360° around a patient, ensuring that the beam precisely matches the tumor's shape profile from every angle.
- It's a less invasive procedure allowing patients to have increased comfort during treatment.
- It reduces the need for some pediatric patients to go under general anesthesia. A treatment plan could involve six weeks of radiation. A child would be anesthetized 30 times, which increases the risk of adverse side effects as well as the cost of treatment.
- The reduction in radiation toxicity greatly improves recovery time and quality of life.

St. Joseph Hospital has earned five 2018 Women's Choice Awards®, distinguishing the ministry as one of America's Best Hospitals in several specialties.



The honor recognizes St. Joseph Hospital as one of America's Best Hospitals for Heart Care, Cancer Care, and Obstetrics and as one of America's Best Breast Centers and America's Best Stroke Centers.

The Women's Choice Award is the only evidence-based designation that identifies the country's best healthcare institutions based on robust criteria that consider female patient satisfaction, clinical excellence, and research on what drives the hospital experience for women versus men.

"The Women's Choice Awards reflect our ongoing commitment to delivering an extraordinary healthcare experience, and we are honored to be distinguished in five categories this year," said Jeremy S. Zoch, Chief Executive of St. Joseph Hospital. "Having our programs recognized by the Women's Choice Award is an honor and reinforces our goal to ensure patients are treated with the highest level of care in a personalized and compassionate setting."

- The Women's Choice Award for America's Best Heart Care signifies that the cardiovascular care provided by St. Joseph Hospital's heart and vascular experts is in the country's top eight percent of hospitals offering heart care services.
- St. Joseph Hospital's Center for Cancer Prevention and Treatment earned the award for cancer care by meeting the highest cancer care accreditation standards of the American College of Surgeons Commission on Cancer, excellence in clinical performance in regard to patient safety measures, and high recommendation rates. The award signifies that the hospital ranks in the top nine percent of hospitals throughout the country offering these services.
- St. Joseph Hospital's Obstetric Services is one of 452 award recipients representing the hospitals that have met the highest standards for obstetrics across the United States. The award identifies hospitals that offer maternity services that also ranked above the national average for patient satisfaction and patient safety.
- As one of the 384 recipients of the Women's Choice Award for America's Best Breast Centers, St. Joseph Hospital is recognized for meeting the highest standards in caring for the needs of female patients, as well as meeting the rigorous standards of the National Accreditation Program for Breast Centers (NAPBC) and having the Breast Imaging Center of Excellence (BICOE) seal from the American College of Radiology.
- Being awarded the Women's Choice Award for America's Best Stroke Centers recognizes the hospital's Stroke Center accreditation by The Joint Commission as an Advanced Primary Stroke Center, as well as the ability to meet the high standards for stroke care as determined by the American Heart Association/American Stroke Association, and high patient satisfaction scores. St. Joseph Hospital was one of 405 hospitals to receive this accolade.

RON THON

"The hospital's many achievements reflect the high quality of care ingrained in the culture at St. Joseph and I want encourage others to lend their support."

Street2Home – Connecting patients with much needed recuperative care and supportive services

The question was how to meet the health care needs of those most vulnerable in our community? Many of the homeless and medically vulnerable in Orange County utilize hospital emergency departments as their primary care facility.

This population of patients, after leaving the hospital, frequently lack a safe environment in which to recover from their illness, injury or surgery. They often do not seek out or receive the follow-up care they need. Back on the streets, daily survival becomes more important than tending to health needs. This results in a cycle of frequent returns to the hospital.

In an effort to help answer that question, St. Joseph Hospital and the Illumination Foundation piloted a program in 2013 with the goals of 1) improving the patient's individual health while, 2) reducing the total annual

healthcare costs that hospitals experienced. St. Joseph Hospital's Emergency Care Center caregivers helped identify participants, treated their immediate medical needs and connected them with the Illumination Foundation staff who helped provide access to housing and set up comprehensive care services (medical care management and behavioral health services).

During that pilot period, St. Joseph Hoag Health hospitals worked with 38 medically vulnerable individuals and saved \$2.8M.

With the outcomes of the pilot looking so favorable, Street2Home was launched in April 2017. This collaborative project between St. Joseph Hoag Health and the Illumination Foundation, and funded by a UniHealth Foundation grant, expands the services of the pilot program while building on its success. It was developed as a countywide safety net system for the most medically vulnerable homeless population in Orange County.

Each partnering hospital designates a caregiver to be their Homeless Care Navigator (HCN) who assists with the complex

needs of the patient. When the HCN is notified of a patient coming in for a screening, the full medical team is ready when the patient arrives. A typical screening lasts just over an hour and upon discharge, the results are shared with the Illumination Foundation to ensure that the patients are connected to all the services they need for recovery.

"We typically have around three new referrals to Illumination Foundation per month," shares Jeannine Loucks, Manager of Nursing in the

St. Joseph Hospital Emergency Care Center. "With the increase of the community services linkage, patients are able to obtain necessary wrap-around services that meet their health care needs."

Glenn Raup, Executive Director of Nursing at St. Joseph Hospital, Emergency Care Center advised "[for St. Joseph Hospital] this new process is a best practice. Re-admittance to the hospital and re-visits to the emergency department

after discharge have decreased because patients have been connected with recuperative care to help manage their follow-up care and chronic conditions."

When discharging a patient to the Illumination Foundation, caregivers breathe a sigh of relief. They know that proper follow-up care will be available for the patient to help them recover in the short-term, along with having access to resources that provide them the chance to improve their physical and mental health in the long run.

- Connecting patients to permanent housing as quickly as possible
- Provide ongoing case management support
