# Providence Hood River Memorial Hospital and communities



In 2021, Providence Oregon continued its tradition of compassion and dedication to our communities, with Providence Hood River Memorial Hospital investing more than \$22.1 million to improve community health. These targeted investments included \$2 million in community health services and \$3.8 million in free and low-cost care.

### PROVIDENCE INVESTS IN OREGON'S HEALTH

#### HELPING HOMEBOUND SENIORS GET WARM MEALS

Providence supported the Hood River Valley Adult Center by providing funds to renovate their kitchen for the Meals on Wheels program. As the COVID-19 pandemic continued to impact the community in 2021, the HRVAC and Meals on Wheels offered much-needed support to people confined to their homes, serving warm, nutritious meals to more than 450 seniors and individuals throughout the area.

#### COLLABORATING TO ADDRESS HOUSELESSNESS

In 2021, a \$34,000 Providence community benefit grant helped the Mid-Columbia Community Action Council convene the Mid-Columbia Houseless Collaborative with the goal of preventing and ending houselessness in the Gorge. The funding was instrumental in launching the collaborative and helping the group advocate for additional Oregon State Legislature funding to support the strategic plan for housing solutions.

#### SUPPORTING THE HEALTH OF VULNERABLE PEOPLE

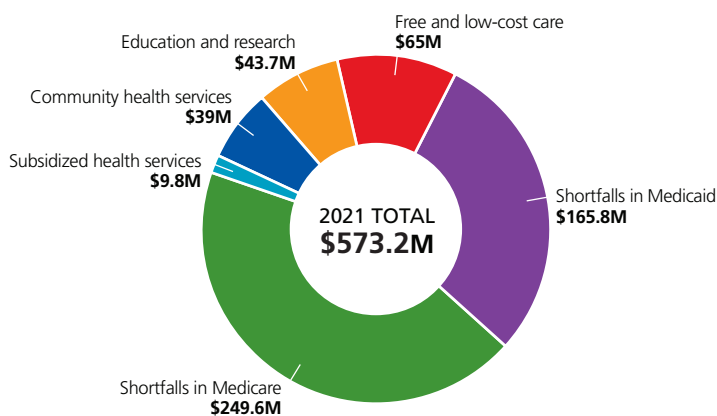
The Providence Hood River Family Medicine Residency program trains physicians to provide care in rural areas while also serving as a health resource for vulnerable people. Partnering with One Community Health, Providence resident doctors helped staff services that included COVID testing and vaccinations, and a warming shelter for houseless populations. They also offered care at the Hood River School-Based Health Center.
