

2021 COMMUNITY BENEFIT SNAPSHOT

Providence Newberg Medical Center and communities



In 2021, Providence Oregon continued its tradition of compassion and dedication to our communities, with Providence Newberg Medical Center investing more than \$22.1 million to improve community health. These targeted investments included \$1.8 million in community health services and \$4.1 million in free and low-cost care.

PROVIDENCE INVESTS IN OREGON'S HEALTH

PROVIDING SHELTER TO PEOPLE IN NEED

A \$25,000 Providence grant helped support the Community Wellness Collective's Harvest House, a Yamhill County shelter for individuals and families without housing, as well as for people needing shelter from domestic violence. Providence also offered medical and behavioral health care for shelter guests. With help from Providence and others, the CWC was able to serve 1,173 people last year.

SUPPORTING COVID-19 VACCINATION IN THE LATINX COMMUNITY

Providence partnered with Unidos Bridging Community, providing a \$20,000 grant to support COVID-19 education and vaccination in the Latinx community. Efforts included sharing evidence-based COVID information in Spanish and providing COVID vaccinations at trusted locations with flexible hours to accommodate farmworkers' schedules. Providence's support helped UBC serve 13,707 people in 2021.

OPENING DOORS TO HOUSING SERVICES


To help provide housing assistance for vulnerable people, Providence supported the Yamhill Community Action Partnership with a \$20,000 grant for its AnyDoor Yamhill coordinated entry program. The partnership helps unhoused people or people at risk of becoming homeless toward self-sufficiency by coordinating housing services, like rental assistance, connection to help with utilities, and referral to shelters and other resources.
