

2021 COMMUNITY BENEFIT SNAPSHOT

Providence Willamette Falls Medical Center and communities

In 2021, Providence Oregon continued its tradition of compassion and dedication to our communities, with Providence Willamette Falls Medical Center investing more than \$36 million to improve community health. These targeted investments included \$2.4 million in community health services and \$4.2 million in free and low-cost care.

PROVIDENCE INVESTS IN OREGON'S HEALTH

PROVIDING FOOD FOR CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

To help address child food insecurity, Providence provided funding for the Clackamas Service Center in partnership with the North Clackamas School District. The CSC operated a free food market at two of the district's elementary schools, offering free groceries, including fresh produce, dairy and meat, to families in need. In six months, the CSC distributed food to 846 families.

HELPING VULNERABLE PATIENTS GET CARE

With a commitment to removing barriers to care for low-income patients, Providence funded the Patient Support Program at all eight Providence Oregon hospitals. Support included helping patients get treatment without worrying about basic needs and helping patients safely transition home. The program served 8,704 clients in 2021, including care for pregnant patients, heart patients and vulnerable seniors.

SUPPORTING THE NEEDS OF BLACK FAMILIES


In 2021, Providence helped fund the Black Parent Initiative to support the First 1,000 Days program, which includes essential prenatal and postpartum maternal services for Black mothers, and other family resources. The Sacred Roots Doula and Lactation services followed by the Together We Can home visiting program have helped improve birth outcomes and the achievement of child development milestones.
