# Providence Medford Medical Center and communities



In 2022, Providence Oregon continued its tradition of compassion and dedication to our communities, with Providence Medford Medical Center investing more than \$33.5 million to improve community health. These targeted investments included \$2.1 million in community health services and \$3.7 million in free and low-cost care.

## PROVIDENCE INVESTS IN OREGON'S HEALTH

### OFFERING HOUSING FOR PEOPLE IN NEED

In 2022, Providence provided funds to support transitional housing in Jackson County through ACCESS, an outreach and peer support organization that offers services for vulnerable people in need. Housing included short-term hotel stays, particularly for people experiencing domestic violence. Of the people ACCESS supported, 73% successfully transitioned to sheltering or housing, including some long-term and permanent housing.

### ADDRESSING MENTAL HEALTH IN OUR COMMUNITY

Providence funding helped support Compass House, an organization that helps adults with mental illness reintegrate into their community and work toward independent and productive lives. Through a program that helps build self-confidence and self-esteem, Compass House was able to serve the needs of 123 adults in 2022 with opportunities that included purposeful work, wellness programs and community activities.

### PROVIDING EMERGENCY CRISIS SUPPORT

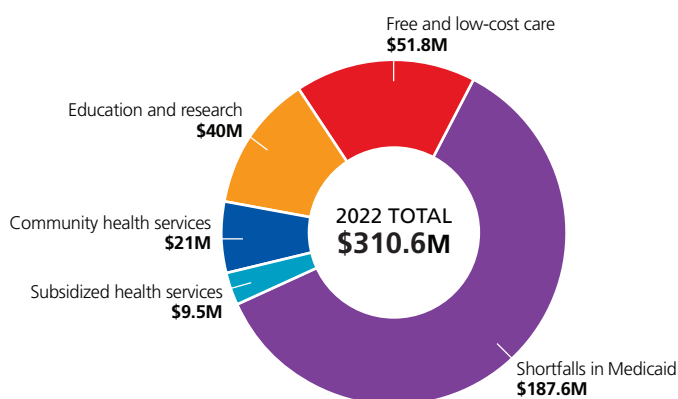
Providence awarded a two-year grant to United Way of Jackson County for a community-based mobile crisis response pilot program to help people experiencing behavioral health crises. The mobile crisis response team includes mental health professionals and emergency medical personnel who offer compassionate and professional support in de-escalating situations and helping individuals get access to needed services.

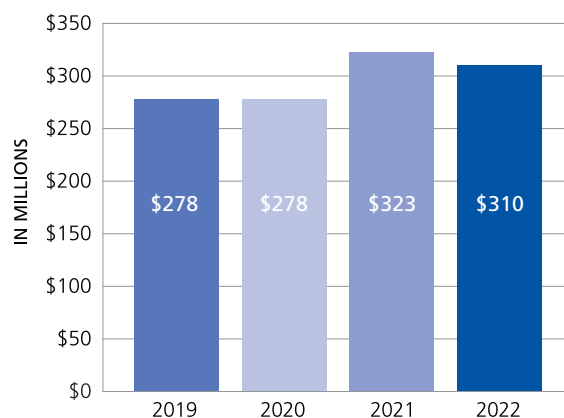
