In 2022, Providence Oregon continued its tradition of compassion and dedication to our communities, with Providence Newberg Medical Center investing more than \$8 million to improve community health. These targeted investments included almost \$1 million in community health services and \$3.4 million in free and low-cost care.

PROVIDENCE INVESTS IN OREGON'S HEALTH

SUPPORTING DIABETES CARE IN THE COMMUNITY

In 2022, Providence awarded funds to Virginia Garcia Memorial Health Center to support its Diabetes Whole Person Care Program. Integrating physical, emotional, social and behavioral health services, the program helps people in the community prevent, treat and manage diabetes. Over the year, the program served nearly 3,500 people and provided more than 8,000 primary care visits.

PROVIDING ACCESS TO HEALTHY FOOD

A Providence grant helped support the low-barrier community food pantry at Newberg's Northwest Christian Church, giving anyone in Yamhill County access to a variety of healthy food at no cost. In addition to providing nonperishable food items and bread for nearly 6,500 people in 2022, the program established a second food pantry in McMinnville to help the local community.

HELPING LATINX PEOPLE ACCESS MENTAL HEALTH CARE

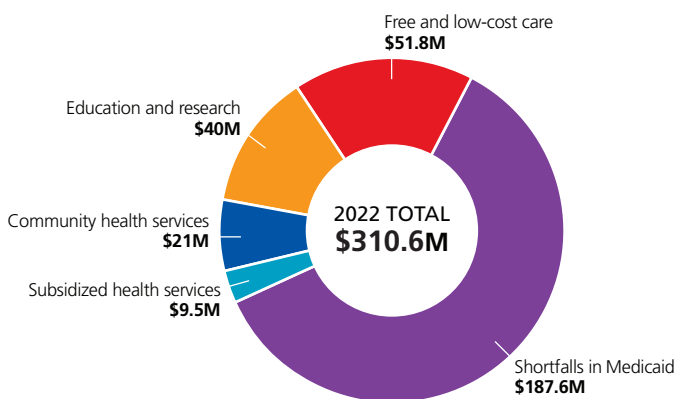
Providence partnered with Lutheran Community Services Northwest and Unidos Bridging Community to help bridge the gaps and reduce disparities in mental health services for the Latinx community. Providence funding helped the partners enhance staff to include culturally specific peer navigators and qualified behavioral health professionals who could provide mental health support for the needs of underserved Latinx people.

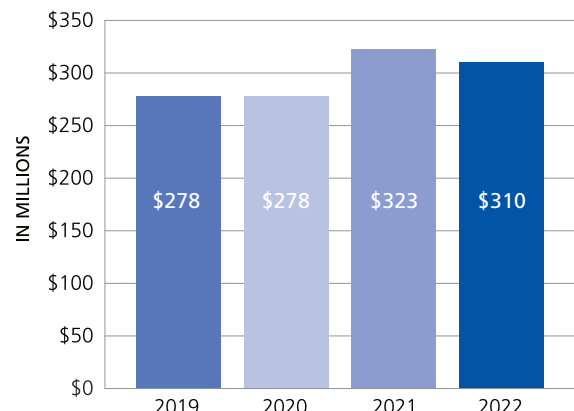
