# Providence St. Vincent Medical Center and communities



In 2022, Providence Oregon continued its tradition of compassion and dedication to our communities, with Providence St. Vincent Medical Center investing more than \$96 million to improve community health. These targeted investments included \$7.4 million in community health services and \$18.4 million in free and low-cost care.

# SUPPORTING PEOPLE IMPACTED BY SUBSTANCE USE

Providence provided funding to Washington County for the development of a comprehensive substance use treatment center to increase addiction treatment capacity. When fully operational, the Center for Addictions Triage and Treatment will provide rapid access to multiple types of substance use care, including withdrawal management and crisis services, for community members struggling with problem substance use.

## WORKING TO END HOMELESSNESS IN THE COMMUNITY

Knowing that housing is critical to health, Providence helped fund a three-year homelessness initiative in Washington County. The Healthcare and Homelessness Pilot is a partnership of local health care organizations, including Providence, and homelessness response systems. The project will work to reduce or end chronic houselessness, support housing stability and help scale effective interventions.


#### HELPING LATINX PEOPLE ACCESS MENTAL HEALTH CARE

Providence funding helped support Northwest Catholic Counseling Center increase mental health counseling opportunities for people with low incomes. With a particular focus on offering behavioral health resources for the Latinx community, the center was able to provide culturally and linguistically appropriate services to clients, including individual counseling sessions, with a cost of as little as one dollar.


