Providence Willamette Falls Medical Center and communities

In 2022, Providence Oregon continued its tradition of compassion and dedication to our communities, with Providence Willamette Falls Medical Center investing more than \$22 million to improve community health. These targeted investments included \$1 million in community health services and \$3.3 million in free and low-cost care.

PROVIDENCE INVESTS IN OREGON'S HEALTH

SUPPORTING SOLUTIONS FOR HOUSELESSNESS

In 2022, Providence supported the development of a local community care center to serve as a hub for organizations working to address homelessness in Clackamas County. The center's ultimate goals are to help people before they become unsheltered, decrease the homeless population in the county, and help restore dignity and life purpose for people impacted by houselessness.

ADDRESSING MENTAL HEALTH NEEDS IN OUR COMMUNITY

Providence funding helped support Northwest Catholic Counseling Center increase mental health counseling opportunities for people with low incomes. With a particular focus on offering behavioral health resources for the Latinx community, the center was able to provide culturally and linguistically appropriate services to clients, including individual counseling sessions, with a cost of as little as one dollar.

PROVIDING A LIFELINE FOR YOUTH IN CRISIS


Providence supported Lines for Life's YouthLine, a critical communication resource for teens and young adults ages 10 to 24 who struggle with social interactions, substance use, self-harm and thoughts of suicide. In addition to Lines for Life staff, the YouthLine is covered by teen volunteers who help their peers through challenging situations.
