



The Summary of Benefits and Coverage (SBC) document will help you choose a health [plan](#). Important Questions	Answers	Why This Matters:
What is the overall deductible ?	\$1,850 employee \$3,650 employee+child(ren) \$4,550 family	Generally, you must pay all of the costs from providers up to the deductible amount before this plan begins to pay. If you have other family member on the policy, the overall family deductible must be met before the plan begins to pay.
Are there services covered before you meet your deductible ?	Yes. Most preventive care services in-network .	This plan covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the deductible amount. But a copayment or coinsurance may apply. For example, this plan covers certain preventive services without cost-sharing and before you meet your deductible . See a list of covered preventive services at https://www.healthcare.gov/coverage/preventive-care-benefits/ .
Are there other deductibles for specific services?	No	You don't have to meet deductibles for specific services.
What is the out-of-pocket limit for this plan ?	\$2,550 employee \$5,050 employee+child(ren) \$6,050 family	The out-of-pocket limit is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other family members in this plan , they have to meet their own out-of-pocket limits until the overall family out-of-pocket limit has been met.
What is not included in the out-of-pocket limit ?	Premiums , penalties, copays or coinsurance for Supplemental Benefits, services not covered, fees above Usual, Customary and Reasonable (UCR) .	Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the out-of-pocket limit .
Will you pay less if you use a network provider ?	Yes. See join.collectivehealth.com/intel-php or call (855) 346-5057 for a list of network providers.	This plan uses a provider network . You will pay less if you use a provider in the plan's network . You will pay the most if you use an out-of-network provider , and you might receive a bill from a provider for the difference between the provider's charge and what your plan pays (balance billing). Be aware, your network provider might use an out-of-network provider for some services (such as lab work). Check with your provider before you get services.
Do you need a referral to see a specialist ?	No.	You can see the specialist you choose without a referral .
