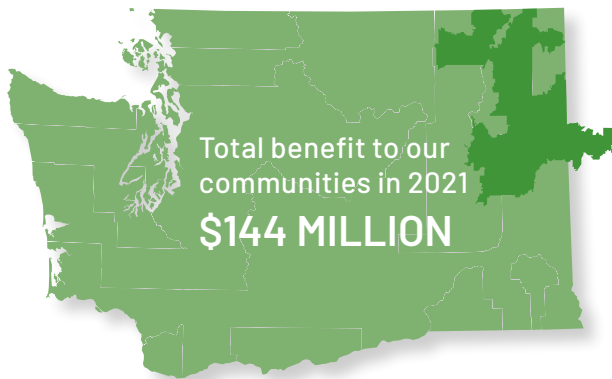


2021 COMMUNITY BENEFIT SNAPSHOT

Financial assistance leads to blue skies ahead.



Preparing to start a family, Ali and her husband have sunshine ahead of them. They wanted to be financially ready, and their only debt is the mortgage on their home in Spokane, Wash.

Life didn't seem so hopeful in the recent past. Prior to her marriage, a slip on some ice, a shattered ankle and two surgeries threatened to fill their future with medical debt. Fresh out of college with student loans and an entry-level job, Ali couldn't envision how she would pay the thousands of dollars in uncovered costs for her care.

"It was scary – I was already living paycheck to paycheck, with no savings," Ali said. "The bills would have affected me for the rest of my life, either through medical bankruptcy or having to take on a more costly payment plan for my student loans."

Ali found the help she needed at Providence, both through the surgeries at Providence Sacred Heart Medical Center and with financial assistance for the costs not covered by her health insurance.

She was hugely relieved when she learned that she qualified for patient financial assistance after one phone call and an online application to Providence. Today, she's paid off her student loans, entered her marriage in a strong financial position and started planning for a family.

"Providence gave me absolute peace of mind during one of the hardest times in my life that I've experienced, and I am immensely grateful," she says. "My life would look very different today if I hadn't received that financial assistance." At age 28, Ali sees blue skies ahead.
