Our shared values in action

Providence St. Jude partners on new health center serving vulnerable people.



Federally qualified health centers, known as FQHCs, are centers that provide medically necessary primary health services and qualified preventive services to individuals and families with lower incomes. In December 2021, Providence St. Jude Medical Center, St. Jude Neighborhood Health Centers and the City of Anaheim partnered to open a new FQHC site in the Ponderosa Park area of Anaheim. The health center is adjacent to a family resource

center, a school and a library to create a comprehensive campus of services in a high-needs community.

The partnership resulted in a new facility where individuals and families can go to receive medical and dental care, and mental health services on a sliding scale of cost. Providence St. Jude contributed \$4 million to fund the building, provided equipment for the new health center and was instrumental in advocating with the City of Anaheim to provide the land for the health center.

Working with our communities and finding new ways to provide care that will change lives is one way we are continuing our path towards health for a better world.
