




Holy Cross Acute Rehab patient demographics comprised of 53.80% male and 46.20% female





Improvement in Self Care SCORES WITHIN 90 POST DISCHARGE


Stroke patients' self care scores showed improvement within 90 days after discharge from Holy Cross Acute Rehab compared to the benchmark

Stroke patients' mobility scores within 90 days after discharge from Holy Cross Acute Rehab compared to the benchmark



Discharge to Community


Holy Cross Acute Rehab's discharge rate to the community is lower compared to the region and slightly higher compared to the nation adjusted rate
