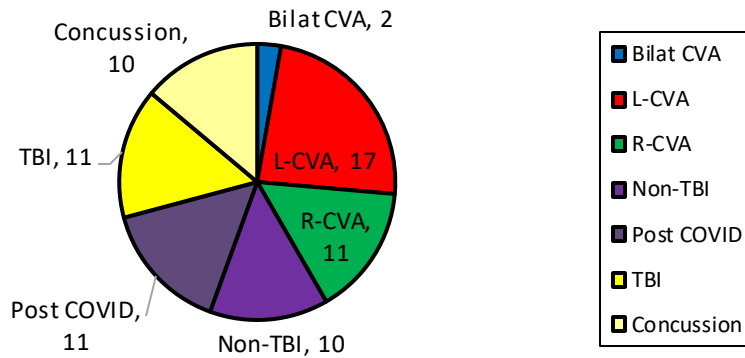


OP INTEGRATED BRAIN INJURY PROGRAM

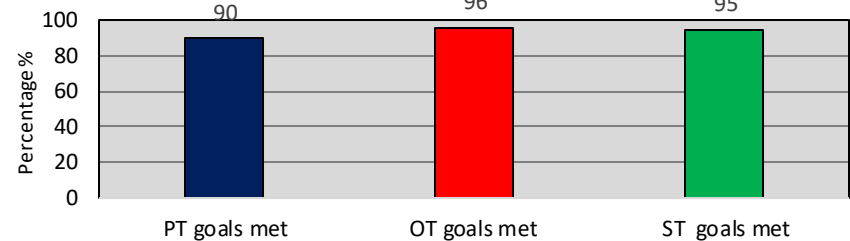
Outcome Report: Jan, 2022 to June, 2022

Program Description: The Mission Hospital Outpatient Integrated Brain Injury Program is a functional therapeutic program for individuals recovering from a trauma or neurological event. The Outpatient Integrated Brain Injury Program provides assessment and treatment in a variety of areas to enable persons served to re-integrate into a productive lifestyle. The program is available to people who were previously more independent but require continued physical and cognitive rehabilitation following injury/illness. The persons served are required to participate in up to three hours of therapy services and community-based activities. Our integrated team model is focused on functional recovery that extends from the hospital to various community services. On May 17th, 2021, Mission Hospital participated in a health system wide change in EMR systems from Meditech/Mediserve to Epic.

Program Summaries

Diagnostic Mix: 42% of persons served had a diagnosis of CVA and 29% of persons served had a diagnosis of Traumatic Brain Injury. Participants with Non-traumatic Brain injury make up the remaining 29%

Percent Improvement by Discipline: Across disciplines, the participants served in the OP Integrated Brain Injury Program met an average of 90% to 95% of their treatment goals, with an overall average of 93%. Additionally, they experienced 13% improvement in FOTO scores and 9% improvement in FOTO communication scores.

Participant Satisfaction: 100% of respondents indicated a high level of satisfaction with quality aspects of staff performance.

Work/School Reintegration: Overall, 86% of the program participants who were working at baseline were able to return to work or school in some capacity.
