### St. Joseph Hospital's Vascular Services again in the News WAVE trial reports Wrapsody superiority over standard PTA

Medical Director of Clinical Trials for the Heart and Vascular Center and Interventional Radiologist Mahmood Razavi, MD, presented data at a FIRST@CIRSE session at the Cardiovascular and Interventional Radiological Society of Europe (CIRSE) annual congress Sept. 14 - 18 in Lisbon, Portugal.

Six-month results of the WRAPSODY Arteriovenous Access Efficacy (WAVE) pivotal trial have demonstrated superior target lesion primary patency (TLPP) with Wrapsody (Merit Medical) cell-impermeable endoprosthesis (CIE) when compared to percutaneous transluminal angioplasty (PTA).

Razavi noted that the six-month analysis provides insight regarding Wrapsody's anticipated long-term performance. "While covered stents and drug-coated balloons have improved lesion patency in these patients, ACPP [access circuit primary patency] still remains a challenge. Results of this trial not only showed superiority of Wrapsody over angioplasty but also numerical improvement over prior technologies," he said. \_-26th September 2024, Interventional News
