Providence Hospital at Home

Providence Hospital at Home provides patients with certain health conditions the choice to receive hospital-level care at home instead of in the hospital.

Patients need to be recommended for the program by a doctor, such as an emergency room provider.

Once you have been recommended for Providence Hospital at Home, a team of care providers will meet with you to go over the program and make sure it fits your needs, living situation, and care preferences. They will answer questions and help you decide if Providence Hospital at Home is right for you.

If you chose to receive your care through Providence Hospital at Home, your safety and access to excellent care remain our top priorities.

While caring for you at home, monitoring equipment and technology are provided so that your care team can stay in contact with you and monitor your progress. Members of your care team will also be coming to your home to check on you.

The first home visit with your Providence Hospital at Home care team will happen shortly after you return home from the hospital.

During this initial visit:


- Your admission into the program will be completed.

Frequently Asked Questions

What are the benefits to me of receiving care through Providence Hospital at Home rather than in the hospital?

With Providence Hospital at Home, you receive safe, excellent, and personal care in the comfort and familiar surroundings of your home.

People who receive hospital care from their home often find the care experience more satisfying. Additionally, they tend to recover faster and decrease their likelihood of going back to the hospital.

Just like traditional hospital care, the Providence Hospital at Home doctor will notify your primary care provider of your admission to the program.

May I leave home while receiving care through Providence Hospital at Home?

For your safety, and to speed your recovery, we ask that you stay home while receiving care.

Just like in the hospital, your level of permitted activity depends on your condition and overall health status.

What does my family member or my caregiver need to know?

A family member or caregiver is expected to be home 24-hours-a-day to assist with your needs.

For safety, your home environment is evaluated before starting the program.

How will I be monitored at home?

While you are receiving care in your home, you will receive visits daily, both in person and by video, from members of your care team.

As with care in the hospital, your Providence Hospital at Home care team will include doctors, nurses, and other licensed healthcare professionals, who will work together to provide care and monitor your progress.

If you have any health needs between your virtual and in-person visits, the Care Center is available 24-hours-a-day, 7-days-a-week.

What if I need supplies?

At no additional cost to you, Providence Hospital at Home provides all the monitoring equipment and supplies that you will need.

These will be sent home with you or delivered to your home.

What if there is an emergency or my condition changes?

For your safety, if a situation requires a return to the hospital, the Care Center nurse will ensure this happens quickly.

The nurse will also alert your doctor and care team members to any change in your condition or location.

What happens once my care is complete?

Once you no longer require care through Providence Hospital at Home, a member of your care team will collect any clinical supplies provided during your care.

A summary of your care is sent to your primary care provider and/or specialist(s). At that time, they will resume your care.

What is the cost difference for me?

There is no additional cost for care with Providence Hospital at Home than there would be for a traditional hospital stay.
