Stroke Care at Providence Everett

When it comes to stroke, the saying goes, "time is brain." This means that the faster a person can receive clot-busting medication, called thrombolytics, the better their chances at a positive outcome. The goal is to administer thrombolytics within 45 minutes or less for at least 75% of stroke patients.
