

## INPATIENT DISMISSAL OF ATTENDING PHYSICIAN

## PURPOSE:

On occasion, an inpatient may dismiss their attending physician. For continuity of care, this is not encouraged, but is sometimes necessary. In these instances, the following principles will be adhered to:

## **POLICY:**

- 1. The attending will continue to direct care until a new attending physician is confirmed.
- 2. The attending will document in the medical record that the patient has dismissed him/her, and that he/she will continue to care for the patient until a new physician is established.
- 3. The patient/family should bear the primary responsibility of finding a new attending physician.
- 4. If the patient/family fails to establish a new attending physician, hospital staff will contact the ED on-call physician in that specialty. If the ED on-call physician is the existing attending or a partner, hospital staff will contact the appropriate Department or Committee chair for assignment.
- 5. The dismissed attending will speak directly with the physician assuming care to provide all pertinent medical information.
- 6. Charts, which indicate a patient/family has dismissed a physician, will be reviewed by the appropriate peer review committee.
