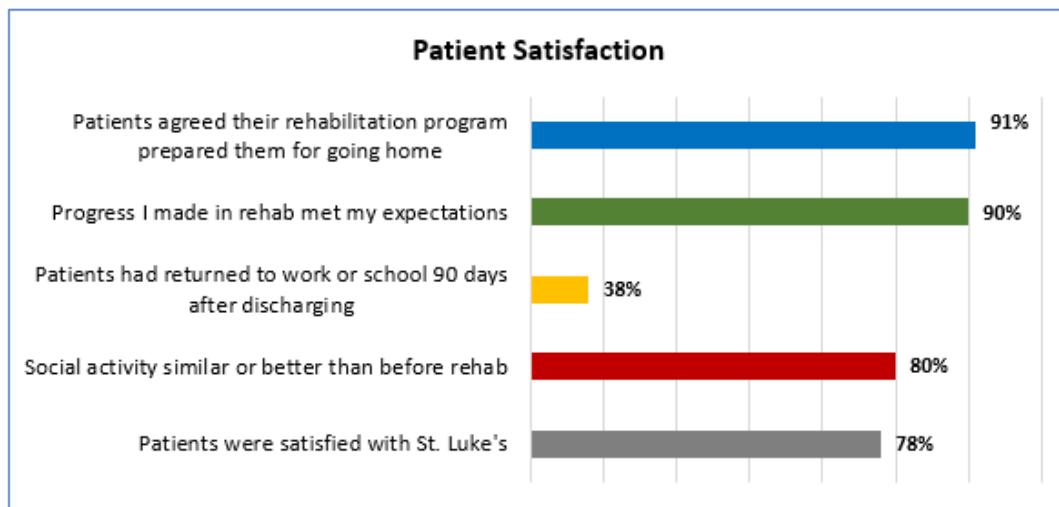




In 2020, patients with brain injury had an average of **3.5 hours** of therapy each day, **over a 5-day span**, as part of their inpatient rehabilitation. Treatment includes physical, occupational, and speech therapy, as well as recreation therapy, vocational rehabilitation, and also rehabilitation psychology. Each patient has an assigned physician specialized in rehab medicine, respiratory therapist, dietitian and chaplain as needed.
