



Brain Injury Rehabilitation Program 2022 Outcomes



In 2022, patients with a brain injury had an average of **3.5 hours** of therapy each day, **over a 5-day span**, as part of their inpatient rehabilitation. Brain injury rehabilitation services are provided by St. Luke's specialized team of physicians, rehabilitation nurses, case management, wound care nurses, dieticians, and therapy staff to include physical, occupational, psychology, recreational, speech and other therapists.

Patient Outcomes — based on a data from UDS (Uniform Data Systems) we achieved higher scores than the Nation in areas of Self-Care and Mobility.





At St. Luke's we treat patients with both traumatic and acquired brain injuries who present with challenges including, but not limited to cognition, behavior, activities of daily living, mobility, community integration and leisure, communication, and swallowing. A brain injury can happen to anyone at any age.


