

Stroke Rehabilitation Program 2022 Outcomes

Patients Served

A cerebral vascular accident (commonly called a stroke) can happen to anyone at any age. In 2022, St. Luke's provided inpatient rehabilitation services to more than 440 stroke survivors with an average length of stay of 14.5 days in the hospital. At Providence St. Luke's, stroke rehabilitation services are provided by an experienced team of physicians, nurses, case managers, psychologists and therapies including: physical, occupational, recreational, and speech therapy. Our patients receive at least 3 hours of therapy per day 5 days a week.
