Community investment in action

Covenant Health gives early Christmas gift to community members

As part of our commitment to community outreach, Covenant Health provides comprehensive dental care to the communities we serve at a reduced cost through the Covenant Community Dental Clinic.

This full-service dental program is designated for low-income and uninsured adults and children. The dental clinic offers screenings, examinations, cleanings, X-rays, sealants, fillings, root canals, crowns, extractions, dentures and oral health education.

In 2022, Covenant partnered with the Lubbock Health Department and local non-profit, Lubbock Impact, to create a dental collaborative. Lubbock Impact operates a free dental clinic periodically alongside its free medical clinic.

To address the long wait list for dental services at Lubbock Impact, Covenant dentists, registered dental assistants and front desk staff participated in a free two-day dental clinic, providing care to area patients in December and providing many in need with an early Christmas gift.

Serving smiles one patient at a time in Plainview

Covenant Health Plainview Dental Outreach program provides four full days of dental clinic services to the Plainview, Texas community every month. The program is part of Covenant Health's community outreach program to help provide access to dental care in areas where services are not available or where service costs may be prohibitive for some.

Nurse Practitioner Greg Curry reminisced on his experience with a patient by saying, "The room lit up, as she smiled for the first time. My heart soared. That will stay with me and reminds me of why I became a health care provider in the first place."

One dental outreach patient had this to share, "Due to increased health problems, my teeth have begun to fall out. I am very thankful for the opportunity of getting the much-needed dental work done through the Covenant Health outreach program."

On average, the clinic treats about 17 patients during its four days in operation each month.
